About SRS

The Sample Registration System (SRS) provides reliable annual estimates of Infant Mortality Rate, Birth Rate, Death Rate and other Fertility & Mortality Indicators at the National and sub-National levels. It is a large-scale demographic survey conducted every year by Office of the Registrar General, India in all States/Union Territories.

Abstract

This Bulletin presents the estimates of Birth Rate, Death Rate, Natural Growth Rate and Infant

Mortality Rate (IMR) for the year 2022 for India and its States/Union Territories. The 'Bigger States/Union Territories' in this Bulletin are those having population more than 10 million as per Census 2011.

In 2022, the Birth Rate for the Country has been estimated at 19.1, whereas the Death Rate has been estimated at 6.8. The estimate of Infant Mortality Rate for the year 2022 is 26 infant deaths per thousand live births.

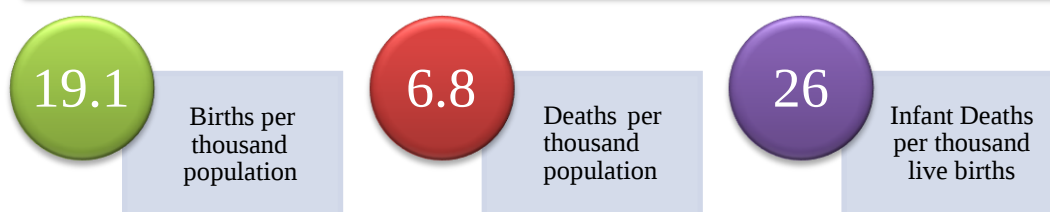


Figure 1: India at a glance, 2022

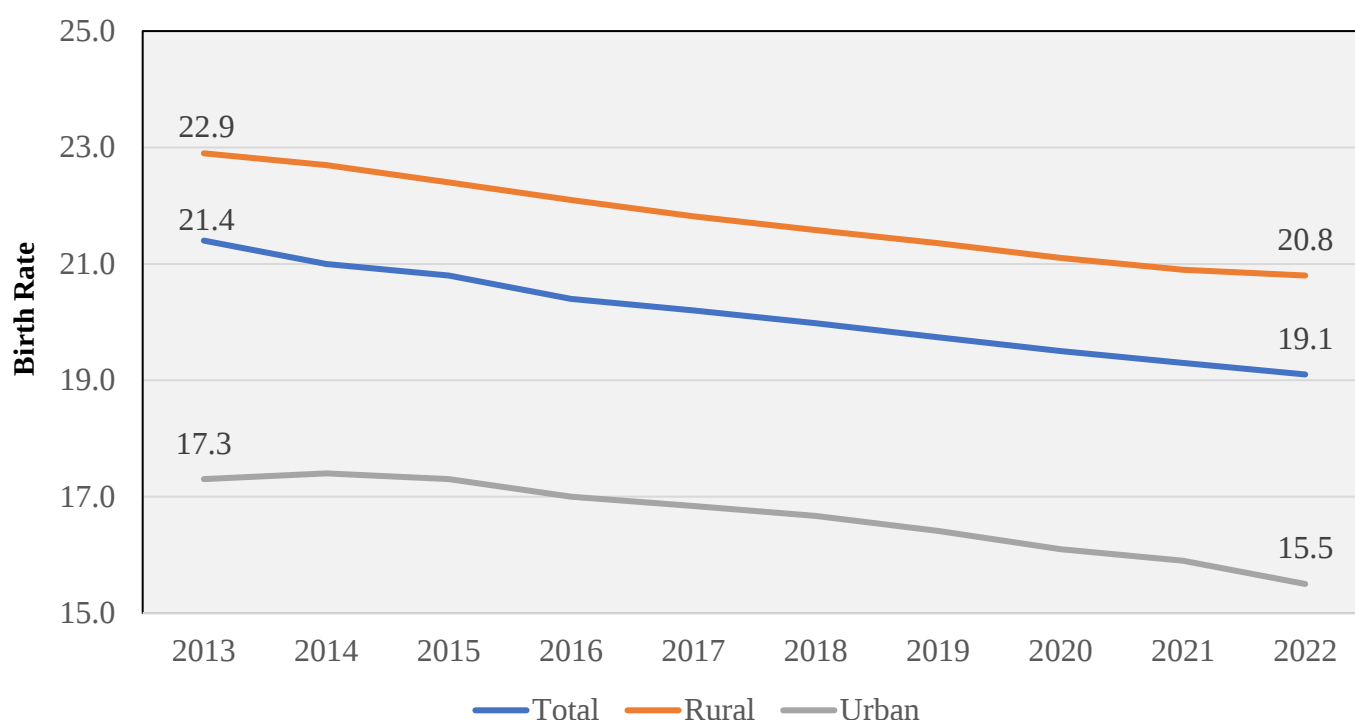
Birth Rate

Birth Rate is a crude measure of fertility of a population and is a crucial determinant of population growth. It gives the number of live births per thousand population in a given region and year.

The Birth Rate at all India level has declined drastically over the last five decades from 36.9 in 1971 to 19.1 in 2022. The rural-urban differential has also narrowed over these years. However, the Birth Rate has continued to be higher in rural areas compared to urban areas in the last five decades. *Figure-2* below shows the level of estimated Birth Rate for India over the last ten years. Birth Rate has declined by about 11% in the last decade, from 21.4 in 2013 to 19.1 in 2022. The corresponding decline in rural areas is 22.9 to 20.8 (about 9% decline) and for urban areas, it is from 17.3 to 15.5 (about 10% decline).

In 2022, the highest Birth Rate has been observed at 26.9 in Bihar, whereas Andaman & Nicobar Islands has the lowest Birth Rate of 10.2.

Figure 2: Birth Rate, 2013-2022

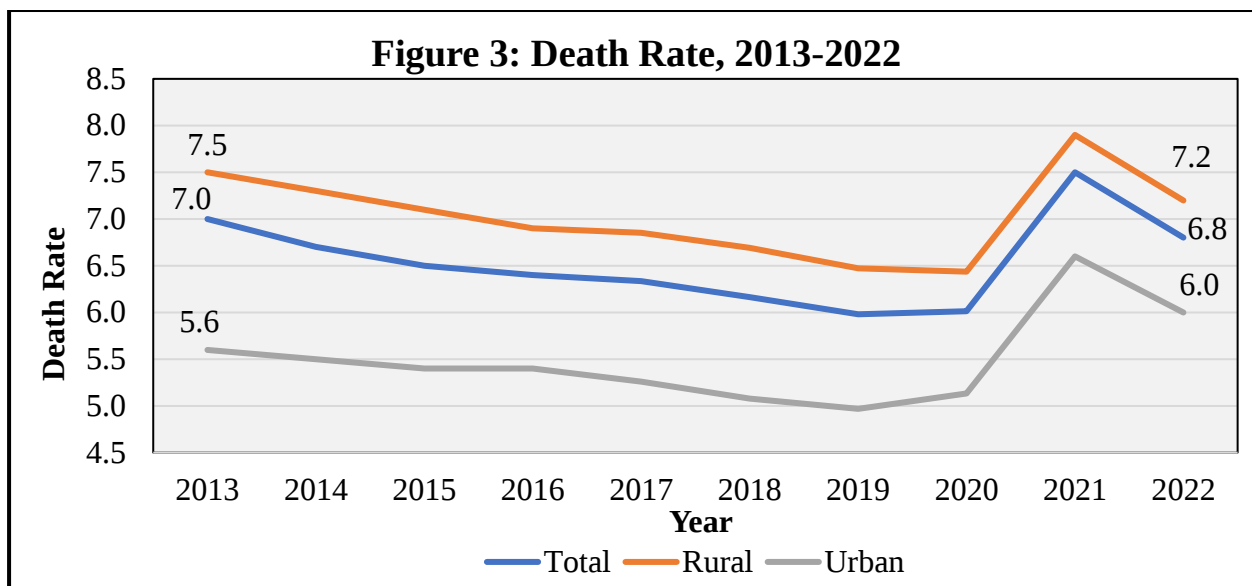


In 2022, Chhattisgarh has recorded the highest Death Rate of 9.0, whereas the lowest Death Rate has been recorded in Chandigarh at 4.2.

Death Rate

Mortality is one of the basic components of population change and the related data is essential for demographic studies and public health administration. The Death Rate is one of the simplest measures of mortality and is defined as the number of deaths per thousand population in a given region and time period.

The Death Rate in India has witnessed a gradual decline over the last five decades from 14.9 in 1971 to 6.8 in 2022. The Death Rate for rural area has decreased from 7.9 in 2021 to 7.2 in 2022. There is a relative decrease in urban area from 6.6 in 2021 to 6.0 in 2022. The following *Figure-3* indicates the Death Rate at rural, urban and all India level for the past ten years.



Infant Mortality Rate

The Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), which is widely accepted as a crude indicator of the overall health scenario of a Country or a region, is defined as the infant deaths (less than one year) per thousand live births in a given time period and for a given region.

The present level of IMR (26 infant deaths per thousand live births, for the year 2022) is less than one-fourth as compared to 1971 (129 infant deaths per thousand live births). In the last ten years, IMR has witnessed a decline of about 35%. The *Figure-4* given below indicates that IMR at all India level has declined from 40 to 26 in the last decade. The corresponding decline in rural areas is 44 to 29, and for urban areas it is from 27 to 18, thereby exhibiting about 34% and 33% decadal decline respectively.

Despite the decline in IMR over the last decades, one in every 38 infants die within first year of their life at the National level (irrespective of rural-urban).

In 2022, the maximum IMR has been reported in Madhya Pradesh (40) and the minimum in Manipur (3).

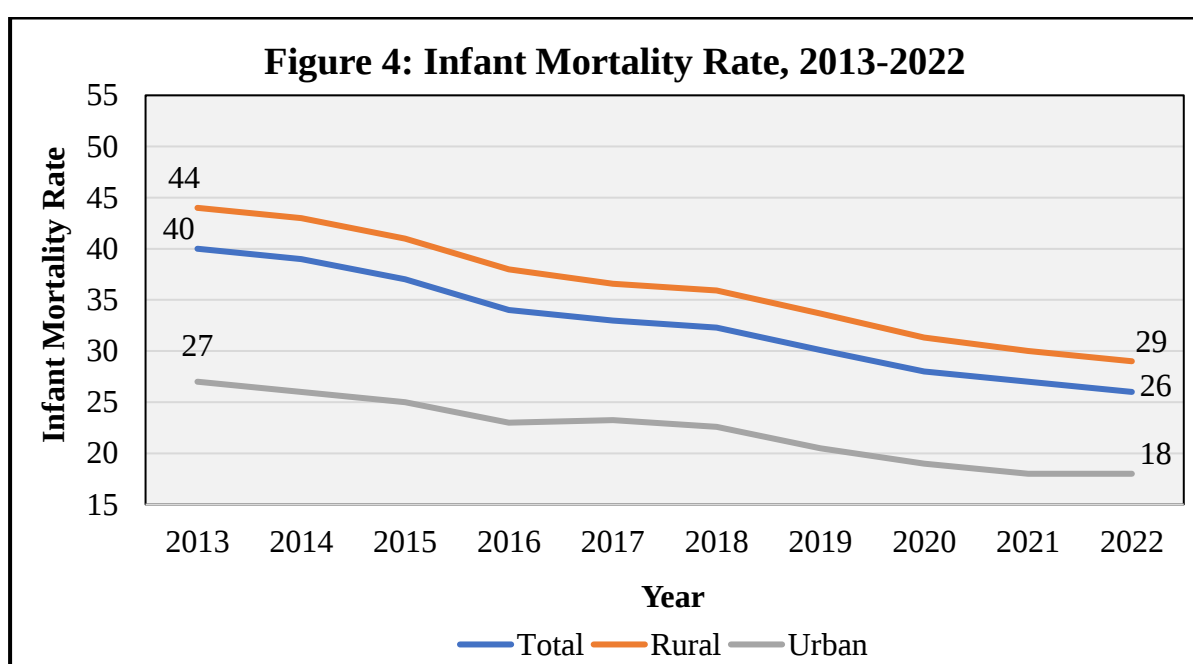
